- As a Clinical Research Coordinator, you will assist the Principal Investigator and research team to conduct clinical research studies

- Performing standard ophthalmic assessments including subjective refraction and visual acuity measurements, intraocular pressure measurements, visual field testing, optical coherence tomography (OCT) imaging and fundus photography
- Performing novel ophthalmic assessments including customised techniques of retinal imaging and functional testing (training to be provided)
