The role & your impact

Reporting to the Program Manager, Primary Clinical Services, the CSM is responsible for overseeing the implementation and maintenance of all aspects of clinical and community awareness services/activities at the centre, developing partnerships with key stakeholders, supporting innovative research and evaluation, managing risk and enhancing operational effectiveness.

This is a broad and busy role providing great opportunities to broaden and enhance both your clinical and management skills in a supportive, positive workplace culture. You will:

- Develop and maintain an integrated model of clinic-based health service delivery to young people, their families or carers;
- Contribute to the service modelling and implementation of quality, innovative youth services across the region;
- Ensure that the operation of the centre is in accordance with the strategic goals, vision and mission of Orygen, and are in line with contractual and license agreements for headspace National Officer and the PHN;
- Provide leadership, supervision, line management, support, and consultation to staff and private allied health practitioners.

- Ability to establish and maintain collaborative partnerships with a range of service providers and organisations.
- Ability to be self-motivated and directed, demonstrating a sound ability to proactively oversee and make decisions in relation to the intake/assessment services and young people's suitability for ongoing treatment/support services at the centre.
