Access Team Clinicians have a direct role in the engagement, assessment and coordination of care, for young people accessing services at our headspace centres in Craigieburn, Glenroy, Melton, Sunshine and Werribee. They assist in the referral of young people to appropriate programs (including research interventions), and participate in community awareness raising activities. These activities promote early help-seeking for mental health and substance use problems in young people.

Allied health professionals, including psychologists, social workers, occupational therapists and nurses, with experience in the provision of mental health care, are encouraged to apply.

Multiple part-time and/or full-time positions are available at each of our five centres, with flexibility to request your preferred fixed number of hours per week, ranging from 0.6 to 1.0 FTE. All positions are available for 12 months with the possibility of renewal subject to funding.

Orygen is also currently recruiting to a number of clinical roles. Similar clinician roles are also available within the Orygen Digital team, and can be found on our [website](#). Orygen is open to “blended” roles where clinicians may work across both programs, such as three days with headspace and two days with Orygen Digital. This opportunity offers exciting possibilities in developing a deeper understanding of health care delivery and technologies for mental health.
